ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

MAY 9, 2022

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The General Division shall follow current CDC health and safety recommendations.
2. While present in a courtroom, all individuals shall follow health and safety protocols as directed by the individual presiding judge assigned to the matter and in accordance with current CDC health and safety recommendations.
3. Inmates shall not be transported from the Summit County Jail, unless authorized by the Administrative Judge.
4. Individuals in any Oriana facility shall not be transported to the courthouse, unless authorized by the Administrative Judge.
5. In the event that a criminal or civil jury trial proceeds, jurors shall report directly to the Ceremonial Courtroom or as directed to an individual courtroom by the Individual Presiding Judge. In the event that an Individual Presiding Judge proceeds with trial in the Ceremonial Courtroom, trial will commence pursuant to the following schedule, with discretion and flexibility to exchange voir dire time slots:

Judge Alison McCarty – Mondays 8:30 a.m.;;
Judge Mary Margaret Rowlands – Mondays 1:00 p.m.;;
Judge Christine Croce – Tuesdays 8:30 a.m.;

Judge Susan Baker Ross – Tuesdays 1:00 p.m.;
Judge Tammy O'Brien – Wednesdays 8:30 a.m.;
Judge Alison Breaux – Wednesdays 1:00 p.m.;
Judge Joy Malek Oldfield – Thursdays 8:30 a.m.;
Judge Kathryn Michael – Thursdays 1:00 p.m.;
Judge Amy Corrigan Jones – Fridays 8:30 a.m.;
Judge Kelly McLaughlin – Fridays 1:00 p.m.

6. All probationers shall report via telephone/video conference, unless authorized by the Director of Offender Services. This provision and timeframe may be modified or extended at any time, if deemed necessary and appropriate to address public safety concerns.
7. The General Division shall continue to have the lawful authority, within constitutional limits, to do and direct to be done all things necessary to ensure the orderly and efficient administration of justice.
